Wendy Rogers is Professor of Clinical Ethics at Macquarie University, Sydney where she holds a joint appointment between the Philosophy Department and the School of Medicine. Her research interests include the ethics of overdiagnosis, research ethics and ethics of new technologies. Her research has informed national and international policy and practice regarding organ donation and surgical innovation. The impact of her work has been widely recognised, including by the National Health and Medical Research Council (with its 2019 biennial Ethics Award) and by *Nature* who listed her as one of "ten people who mattered in science" in 2019.
